California Water Commission meeting to include tour of Prop. 1-funded Water Storage Investment Program project in South Sacramento County

June agenda also includes presentations on the State's standing drought task force, Water Supply Strategy, and California Salmon Strategy

The June 18 meeting of the <u>California Water Commission</u> will include a tour of the <u>Harvest Water Program</u>, the first project to be funded by the Commission's <u>Water Storage Investment Program</u> (WSIP). The Harvest Water Program will provide reliable, high-quality recycled water to agricultural lands and existing habitats in southern Sacramento County, allowing local agricultural operations to pump less groundwater and offer natural recovery in the groundwater basin.

The meeting will begin in the California Natural Resources Building Sacramento. Following the lunch break, the meeting will resume at the Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge in Elk Grove. The tour is open to the public.

Members of the public are responsible for their own transportation to Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge. Free parking is available in the visitor's lot. From there, a bus will provide transportation throughout the approximately 2.5-hour tour. Comfortable clothing and comfortable walking shoes are recommended.
