Subject: Support for Reallocation of Water Storage Investment Program Funding to Sites Reservoir

Dear Chair Stener and Commissioners,

On behalf of the Southern California Water Coalition (SCWC) and our diverse membership of public agencies, businesses, environmental organizations, and community leaders, we express our strong support for the reallocation of Water Storage Investment Program (WSIP) funding to the Sites Reservoir Project.

Sites Reservoir is a 21st-century, multi-benefit water storage project that will deliver a more resilient and reliable water supply for California's communities, farms, and environment. This once-in-a-generation opportunity will expand our off-stream storage capacity and capture up to 1.5 million acre-feet of water during wet years for use during dry periods—helping safeguard our water future in an era of climate uncertainty.

Critically, Sites Reservoir introduces a groundbreaking approach to the ecosystem public benefit envisioned under Proposition 1. It will be the first and only reservoir in California designed to capture and store water specifically for the environment, ensuring dedicated supplies for fish and habitat restoration. The environment will be the single largest "user" of water from Sites Reservoir, marking a fundamental shift toward prioritizing ecosystem needs in our water management strategies.

Beyond these environmental benefits, Sites Reservoir has been designed to balance water supply reliability with environmental stewardship, providing far-reaching advantages:

Water Storage & Resiliency

- Supports California's Water Supply Strategy to create storage for 4 million acre-feet of water.
- Captures excess stormwater from the Sacramento River, reducing reliance on diminishing snowpack.
- Operates in coordination with the State Water Project and Central Valley Project to improve flexibility and reliability in both wet and dry years.

Climate Adaptation

- Performs best under future climate conditions with more extreme rainfall events.
- Leaves ample water in the Sacramento River and Delta for ecological needs while capturing high flows for later use.

Agricultural Sustainability

• Provides reliable supplies to sustain California's agricultural economy, ensuring a stable food supply and supporting rural communities.
