

Both the center and the lake are facilities of the California State Water Project (5WP), the nation's largest state-built water development and distribution system. The SWP serves both urban and agricultural areas in Northern and Southern California, as well as the San Francisco Bay area, the San Joaquin Valley, and the Central Coast.

The 40-foot-long model is marked with mile posts and elevations to show the distances and heights that water travels through the SWP's complex system of pumping and power plants, canals and pipelines to reach its destinations.
