Emergency Response Public Benefit

- Unplanned Infrastructure Outages
 - Statewide or locally
 - Declared emergency
 - Examples
 - Delta levee failures
 - Accidents
 - Terrorism
 - Earthquakes



Changes from Application Stage

- Term changed from 50 years to 35 years
- Volume remains the same – up to 50,000 acre feet



Drought Emergencies

- Critical Year in the third or later year of multi – year drought – “DDDC” or “DDDC” (D is dry and C is critical year)
- And/or government declared drought



Requirements

- Up to 50,000 acre feet over 35-year CAPB term
- Provide stored groundwater to local water agencies in a qualified emergency
- Agreement with Metropolitan Water District of SoCal
- Emergency water used is “paid back” over time



Compliance

- Annual production of 15,000 AF recycled water for recharge
- Maintain Metropolitan Water District Agreement
- Maintain agreements with local partners
- Annual Reports and Adaptive Management Reports
- Amount of emergency supply provided



Adaptive Management

- Monitor development of groundwater storage available for emergencies.
- Monitor implementation agreements.
- If no emergencies – still in compliance because stored water is available.



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
