SEED (Sequoia Environmental Education Directive), the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) and the Water Education Foundation's Project WET Program invite educators working with students in grades 3-12 to a workshop on climate change and California's water resources.

Understanding climate change and its link to flood, drought, water quality, and more is crucial for all Californians. Join us to interact with DWR scientists and water education experts. You'll practice activities that will help your students understand how climate change impacts water and how they can adapt to our changing environment.

Project WET activities engage students in the study of water through interactive simulations, use of models, and reality-based scenarios. The interdisciplinary activities supplement existing curriculum, are correlated to Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards, and provide strong foundations for STEAM, Project-Based, and Service-Learning programs.

Workshop participants will receive a \$120 stipend, continental breakfast & lunch, the new Project WET "Water in Earth Systems" curriculum guide, and the opportunity to earn 0.8 CEU credit. Registration fee is \$25.
