

Draft basin boundary modifications open for public comment through Jan. 4

Integrated water management conference will include look at water in the sky A draft list of <u>basin boundary modifications</u> has been released by DWR. The list is a response to local agencies that requested modifications based on scientific or jurisdictional reasons. A <u>public meeting</u> on the modifications will be held Tuesday, Dec. 11, in Sacramento. <u>Public comments</u> will be accepted through Jan. 4.

First meeting for advisory group looking into small water system vulnerabilities

The County Drought Advisory Group has scheduled its <u>first meeting</u> on Dec. 13, in Sacramento. The group will be gathering information on factors that make small water systems and rural communities vulnerable to water shortages. Recommendations for reducing those vulnerabilities will be sent to the governor and Legislature.

Report for Congress looks at California water infrastructure The Congressional Research Service has released a new report, Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act:

Bureau of Reclamation and California Water Provisions. It provides background and context to selected drought- and water-related provisions in the WIIN Act as they apply to California, and in particular, the Central Valley Project.
