Basin Boundaries and Hydrology

The Happy Camp Town Area Groundwater Basin is an irregularly shaped basin that follows a short reach of the Klamath River. The basin is bounded on the west by the western Jurassic belt of the Klamath Mountains consisting of Upper Jurassic marine metasedimentary rocks. The eastern half of the basin lies within the western Paleozoic and Triassic belt and is bounded by pre-Silurian metamorphic rocks. The basin is comprised of Quaternary non-marine terrace deposits (Wagner 1989; Strand 1963).

Annual precipitation in the basin ranges from 51- to 57-inches.
