# Who-To-Contact

## Resources for Well Users

**For household well owners or residents on groundwater wells, see the contacts below, provided by the California Department of Water Resources, for resources and assistance related to your well.**

### To Obtain a Well Permit

### To Deepen an Existing Well or Drill a New Well

### To Report a Dry Well

If your well has gone dry, you should report it to the California Department of Water Resource's online Dry Well Reporting System: [mydrywell.water.ca.gov/report](http://mydrywell.water.ca.gov/report) (voluntary). If you are receiving support from Self-Help Enterprises, they will help make sure your dry well is reported to the State.
